


Physical Description:

Single-story plus attic, 3 x 4 bay, stucco-clad, wood-frame Craftsman residence. Asphalt-shingled gable roof with a single centrally-located eyebrow dormer. The roof shingles wraparound the eaves of the house in an effort to imitate a thatched roof. Cobblestone endwall (W) chimney. Concrete foundation.

Centrally-located primary entry is sheltered by half-round wooden

overdoor supported by wooden brackets. The entry is flanked by square picture windows on the main (N) facade. Secondary entry on side (E) facade.

The site is raised slightly from that of the street.

Associated structure: Detached three-bay (originally stucco-clad) wood-frame garage is situated to the rear (S) and west of the main structure. It straddles the property line and is shared with its neighbor (514 Fifth Street). It was built c. 1939 and has been extensively renovated (the easternmost bay was added and the main facade resided with aluminum) since its original construction and would not contribute to the proposed historic district.

Historical Information:

The earliest water and sewer records shows that the building was constructed in 1928 and was originally owned by Samuel F. Hildebrand. Conversations with the present owner and with Betty Jane Harper, Charles Harper's daughter, indicate that Charles Harper constructed the building.

Mr. Hildebrand's wife and Mr. Charles Harper's wife were sisters and regular church members of the Christian Science Church in Havre. Samuel Hildebrand was a professional house painter and often worked in conjunction with Charles Harper on many different construction jobs.

Excellent. This building retains its original configuration and massing, its historic fabric (exterior stucco walls) and several distinctive styling details (cobblestone chimney, eyebrow dormers and entry overdoor).

Significance:

This structure retains its historic character and architectural integrity and would qualify for the National Register under criteria C as a contributing component to the proposed historic district.
