

Physical Description:

One story wood frame bungalow. 3 x 3 bay. Gable roof over square plan. Exposed rafters and purlins. Asphalt shingled roof (originally wood shingled). Clapboard siding. Raised concrete foundation with wood water table. Interior brick chimney.

Open porch on facade (N). Gable roof has exposed rafters and purlins. Roof is supported by square columns resting on brick veneer piers. Porch bays are flattened arches. Porch gable-end is clapboard clad. Clapboard siding. Entry is central to facade. Concrete steps lead to porch. Steps are carpeted and are flanked by brick abutments with concrete caps. Door is wood with

multi-lights and storm addition.

Facade has 2/2 awning type windows. Windows on walls and rear facade are combination 2/2 awning type and 1/1 double-hung sash.

Site is slightly raised and bermed to level of sidewalk.

Historical Information

The 1920 Samborn map shows this house as one story with a wood shingled roof. The rear entry was enclosed and there was an open porch covering the east one-half of the facade. By 1939, there had been no significant exterior alterations.

Frank Jestrab is listed on the sewer record as the original owner of this house. Frank and Phillip Jestrab were owners of the Jestrab Brothers Hardware Store. In 1919, Mrs. S. Cosgrove applied for a water connection to the house. There is no listing for her in the Polk Directories. By 1929, Harold and Annie Lerty were living in the house. Harold was operator at the Western Union office, while Annie was employed as a nurse at the Havre Clinic.
